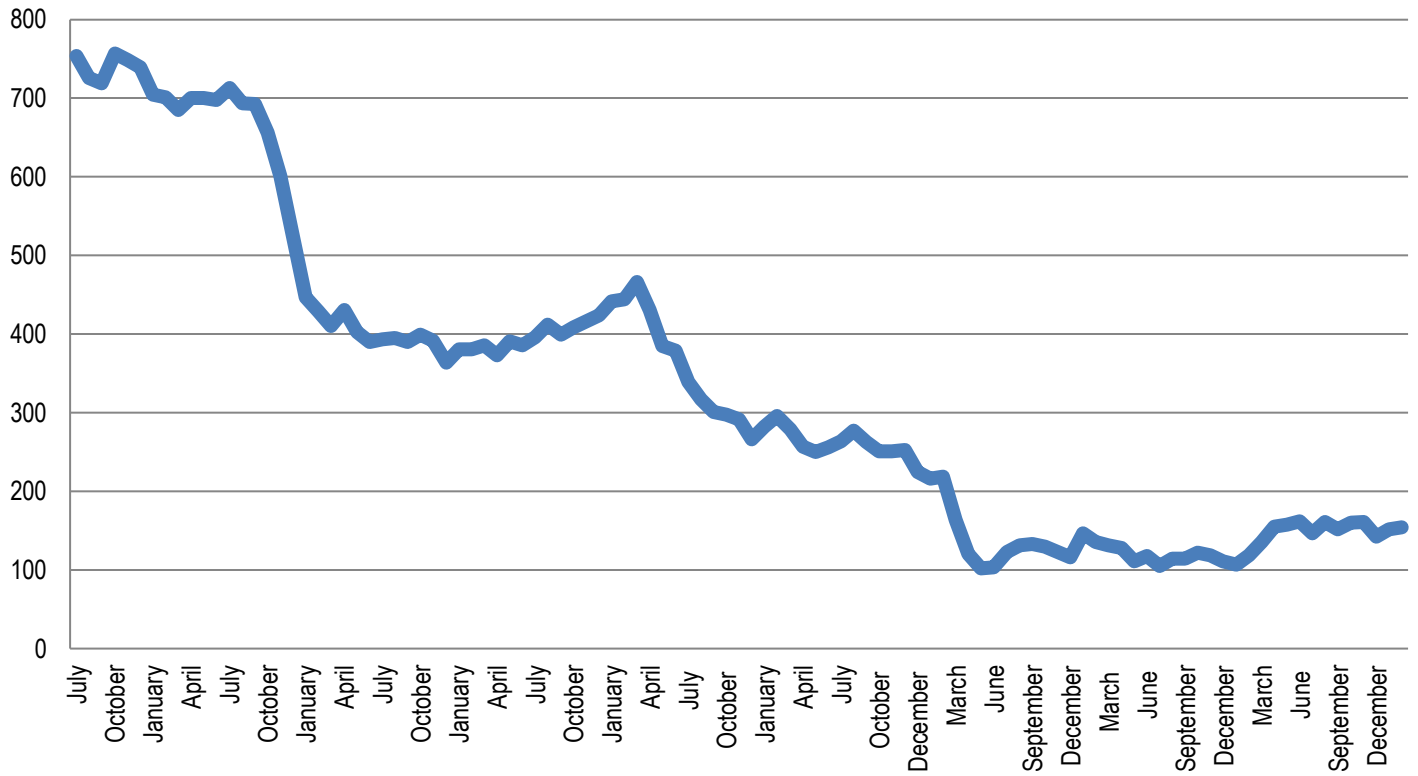

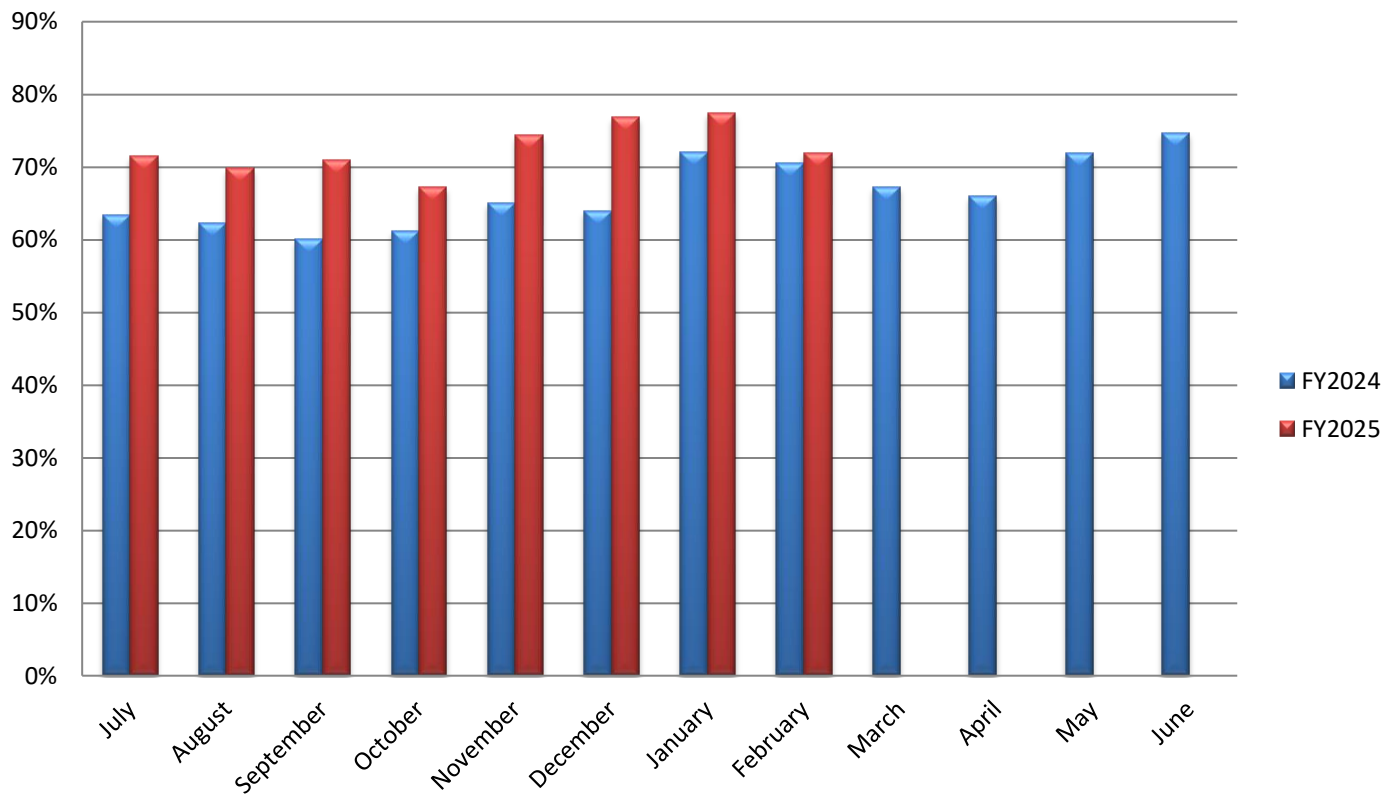

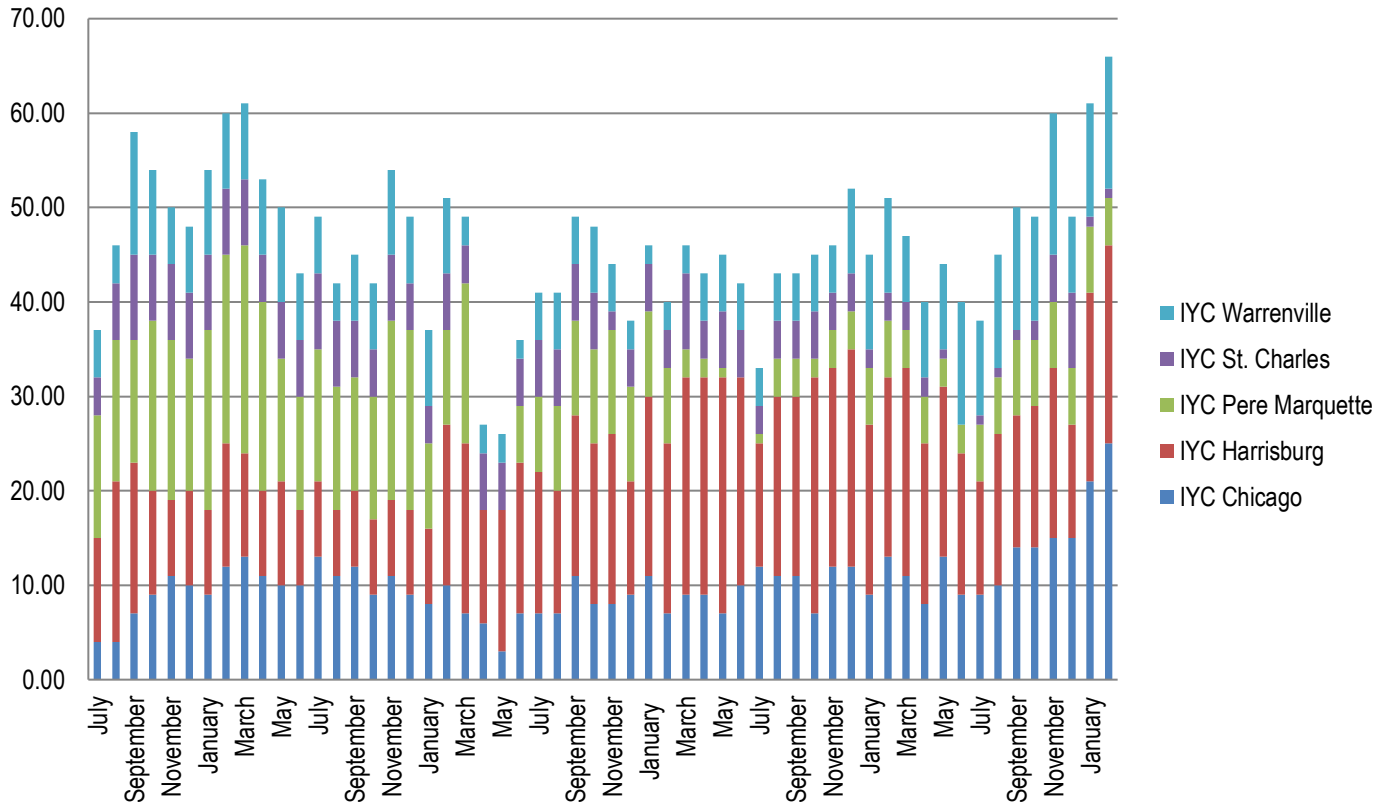

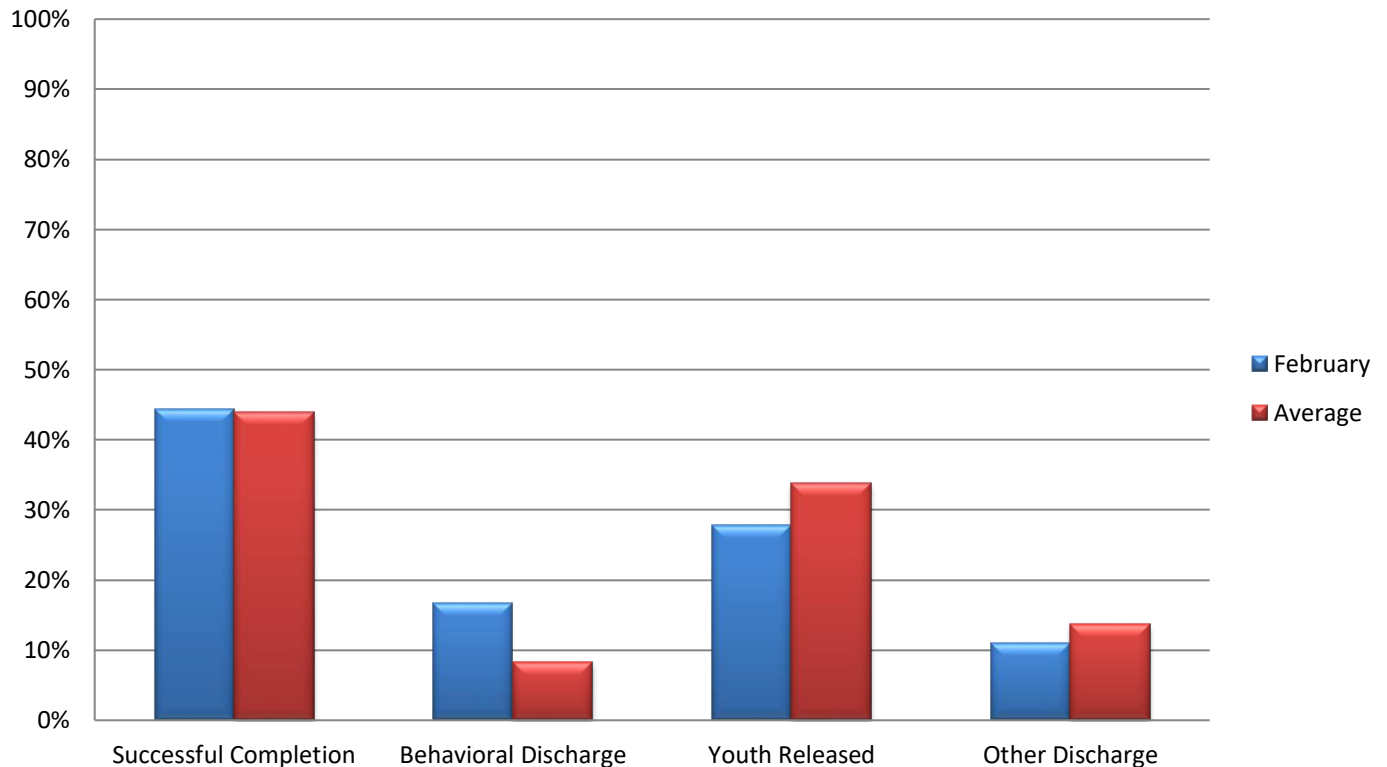

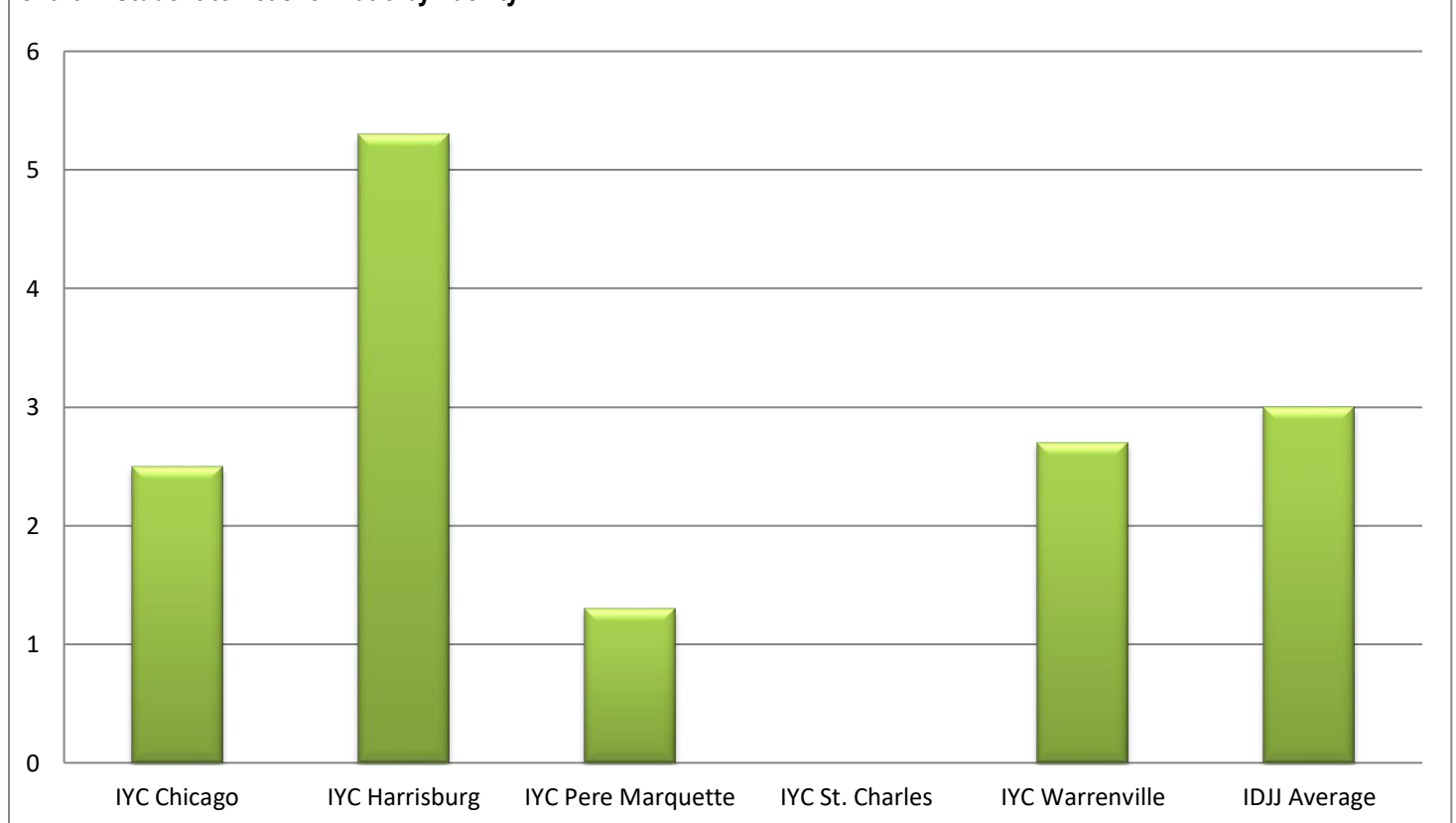

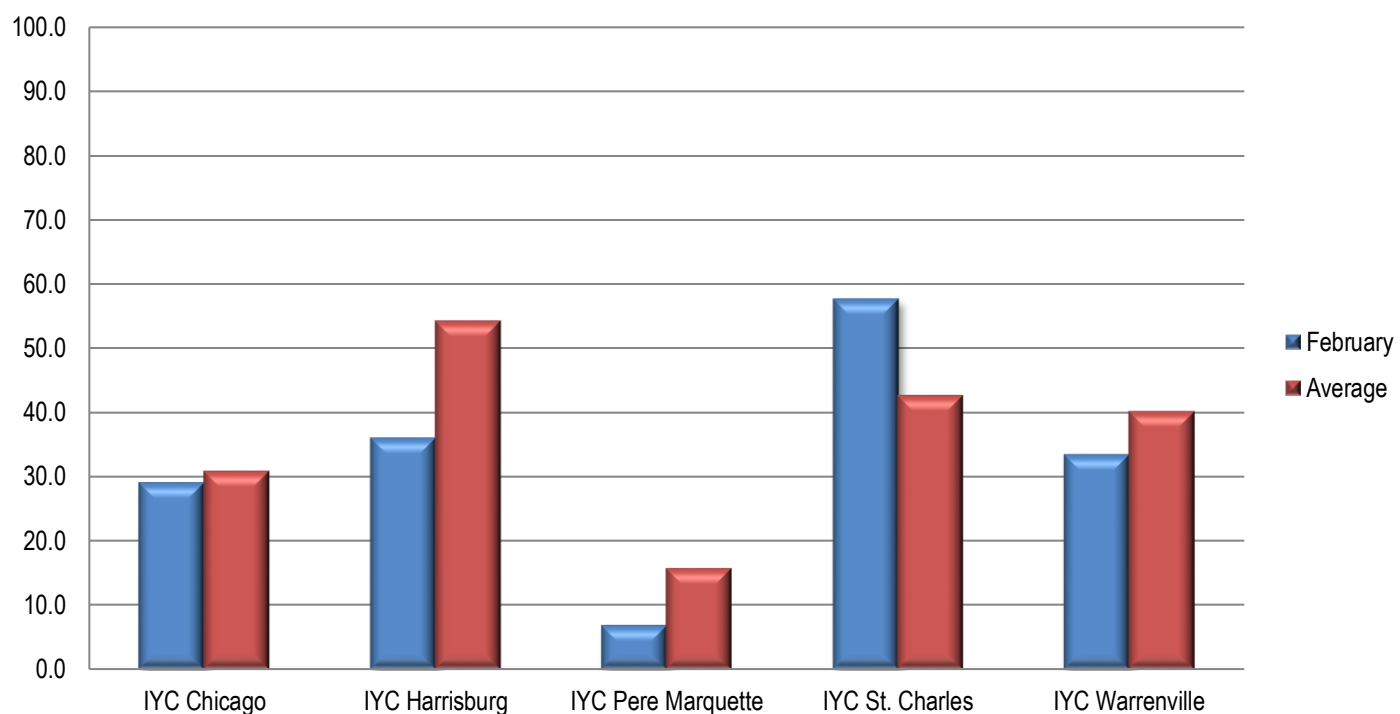

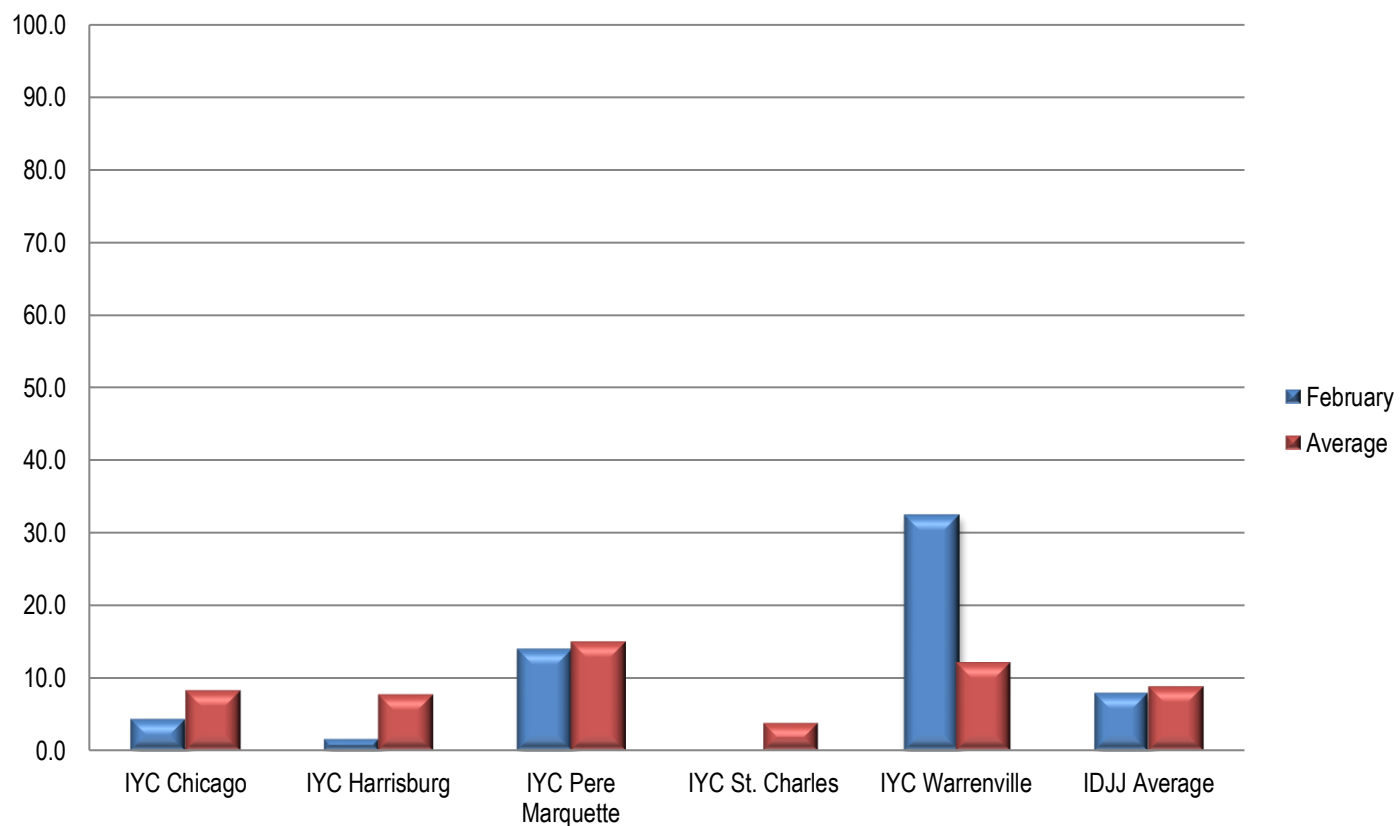

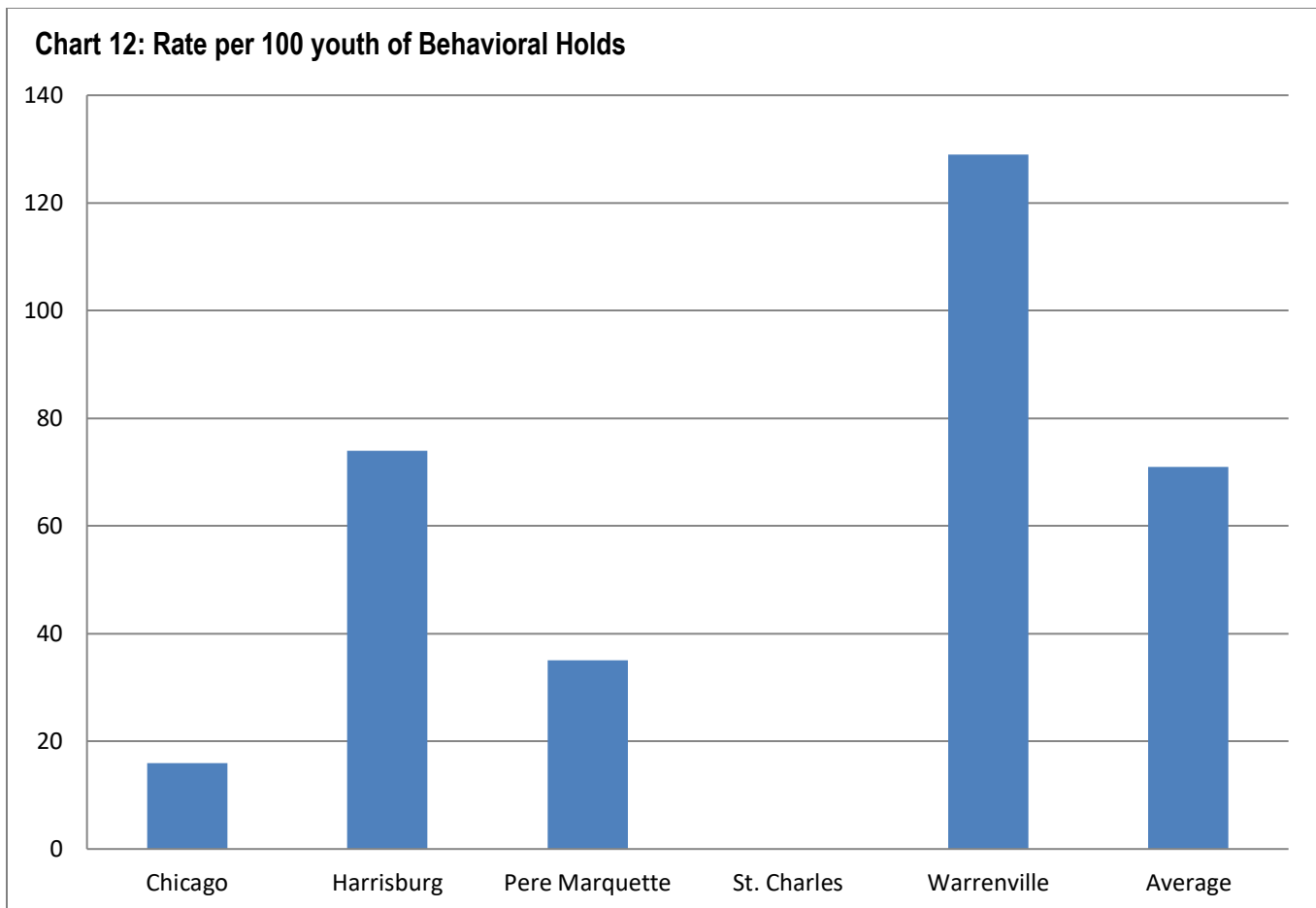

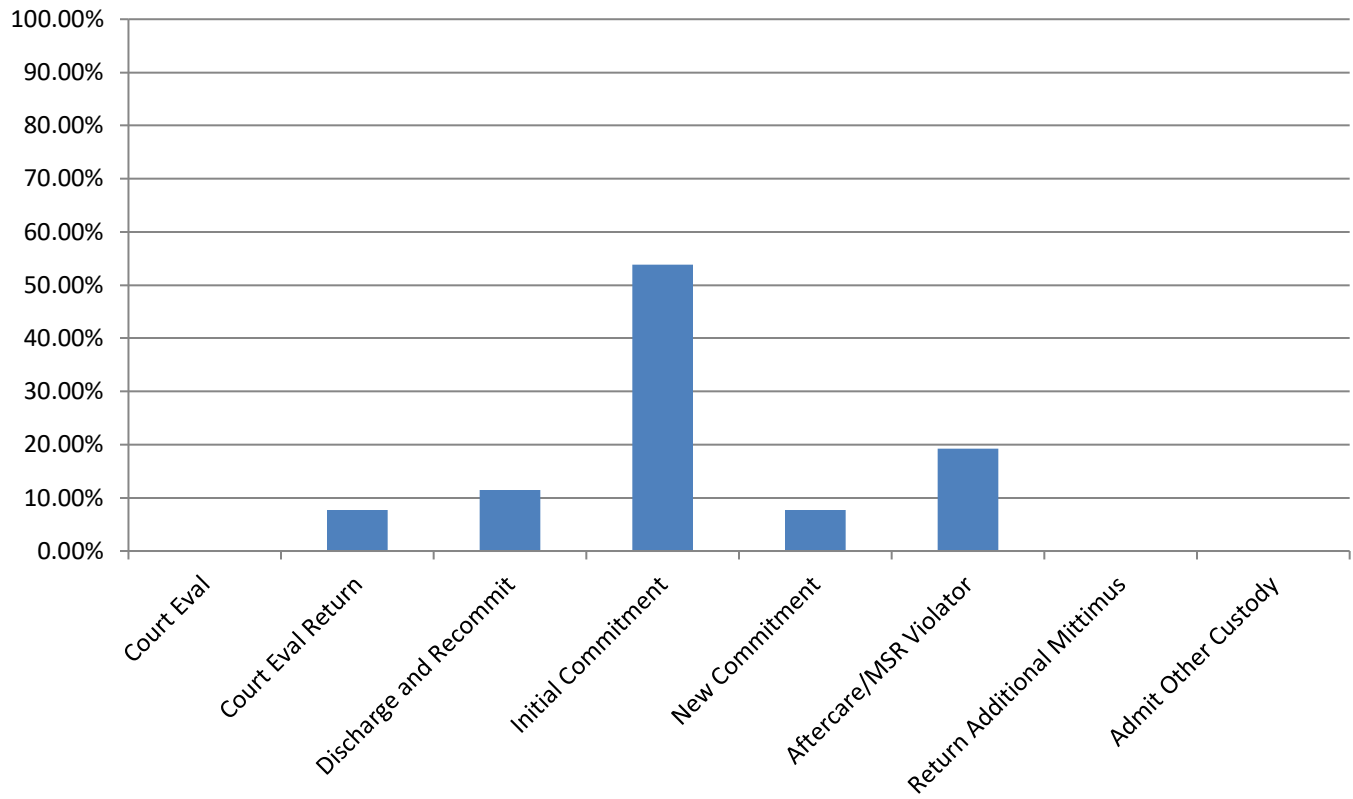

Chart 14: Types of Adjustments used by Agency

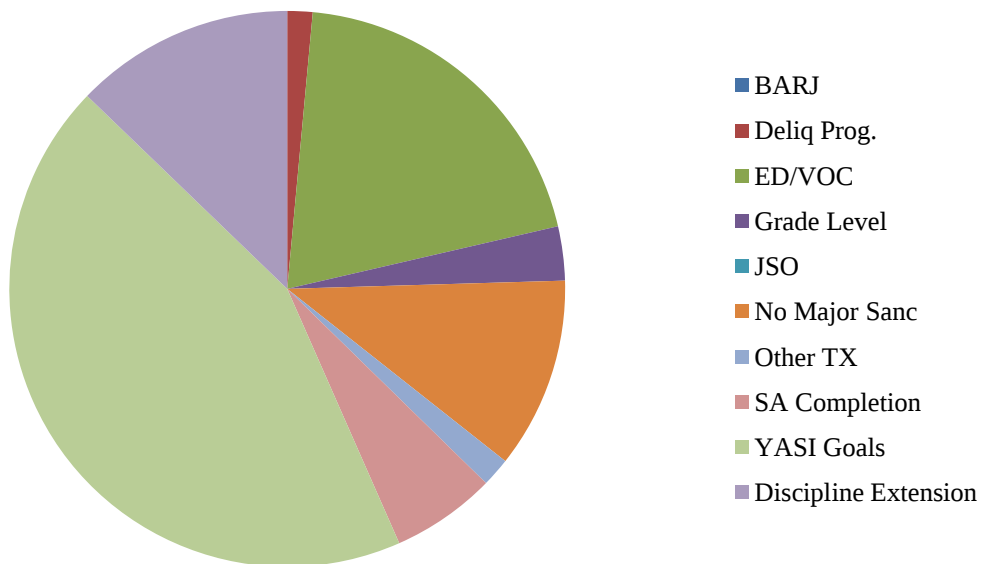


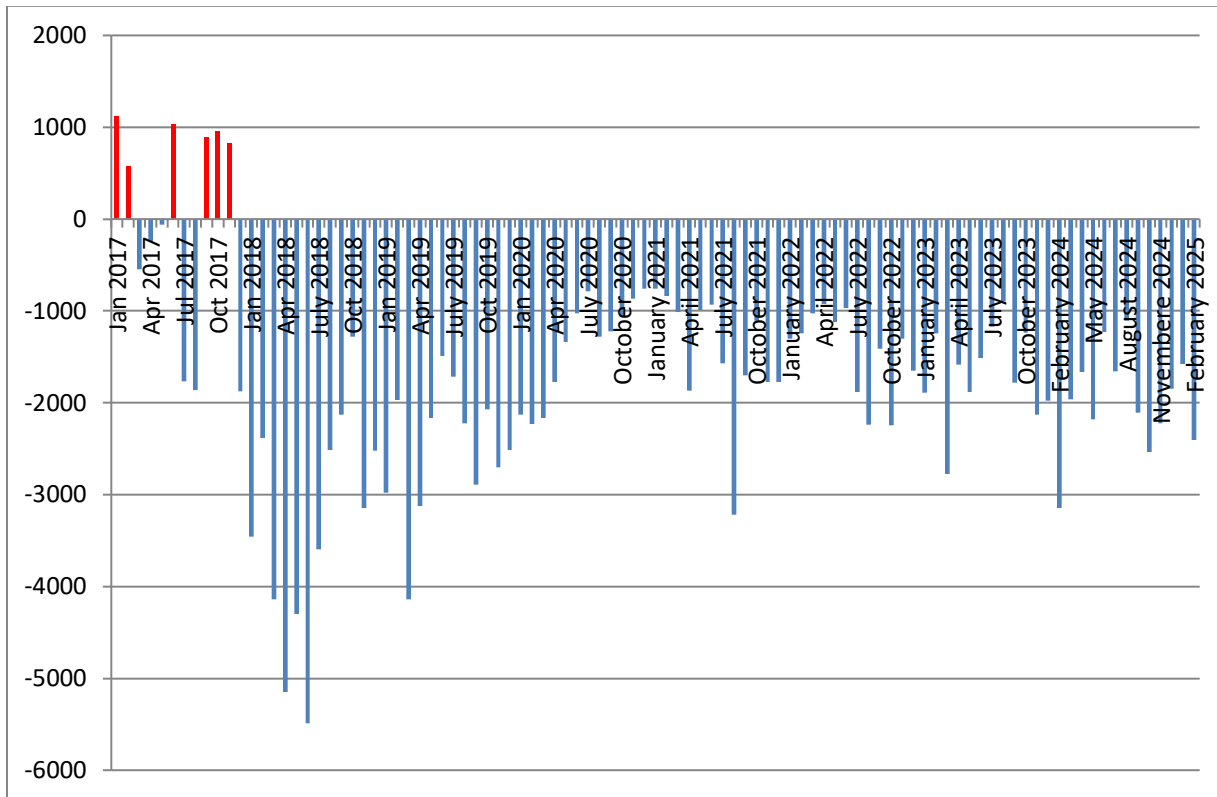

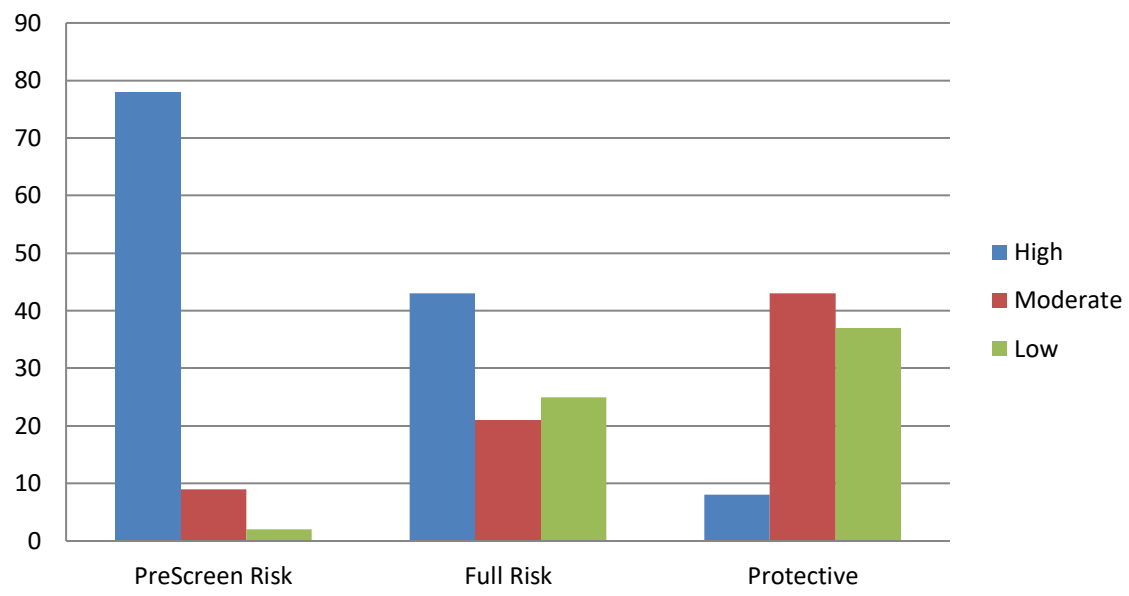

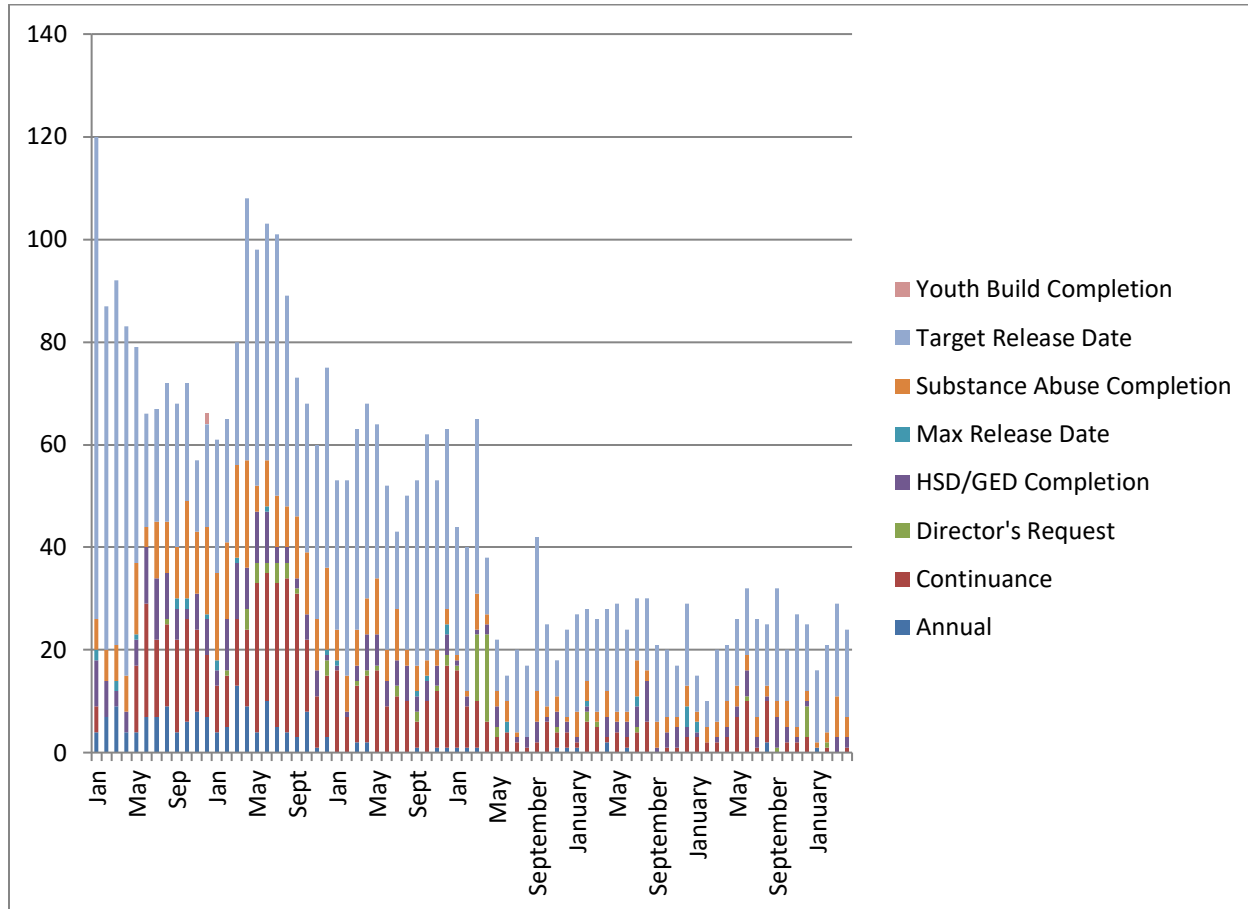
