School Updates: Glencliffe Academy and Maya Angelou

Cynthia Houston, Principal at Glencliffe Academy at IYC Pere Marquette. There are currently eleven students enrolled, four are special education. There have been six graduates, to this date. Four students are enrolled in Elgin College 101. Four teachers are in monthly rotation to assist with continuing education at the Department of Corrections. Despite school displacement, school has been ongoing. Glencliffe will soon onboard Delta T Substitute.

Summary February/March 2025 Curriculum Update

DR. BAMBI BETHEL-LEITSCHUH Continuing with Curriculum and Instruction, Physical Education and Health teachers will meet to review core areas to implement a review of the courses to be available online to be used at IDJJ and DOC. One course will meet the needs for graduation requirements and the other to further elective opportunities.

ACT will be for Juniors and Seniors who have yet to complete. They will be held late April. The use of chrome books is still in the works.

Google classroom has identified a professional learning community representative within our district. There will be a training on April 1st, with implementation in May. It will be a piloted between April-May. Four teachers have been hired. There is a currently three sites, Pickneyville will open in April. Shawnee and Illinois Rive have has one graduate.

ECC, Elgin Community College 101 is at Pere Marquette.

D&D Solar is awaiting final signatures. The plan is to start with a small cohort.
